The South Australian Rainbow Advocacy Alliance (SARAA) is a systemic advocacy organisation working to advance the rights and wellbeing of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans and Gender Diverse, Intersex, Queer, and Asexual (LGBTIQ+) people across South Australia.
